
## Wise Words From Seniors to the Freshmen

"Not very much, only had to ask for help once or twice the first week." Matthew Butchers ('20) "How hard was it for you to adjust?"


"For me it was half hard and half easy. Making friends and finding classes was easy, but doing [the] classes are hard."
